Activity Ideas - Bedtime

Bring a flashlight to your child's room and darken their room a little. Start telling a story about things in their room and have them help tell the story by naming different objects that you point out with the light of the flashlight. Let your child name the objects and help tell the story. A simple activity like this helps children with two important early literacy skills: vocabulary building and narrative. Children that help tell stories begin to understand sequencing which leads to comprehension

This is a fun activity to do with the book Llama, Llama, Red Pajama.

Have your child make up silly sentences using rhyming words. Use simple starting words like: cat, frog and pig. Recognizing words that rhyme is an important skill that helps children figure out new words once they start reading.

Learn rhymes, songs and finger plays.
